What have we been doing this week?



Our **Reception** children have been settling beautifully into their new classrooms and are gradually getting used to the daily routines. It's been lovely to see them becoming more confident and comfortable with each passing day, as they explore their learning environment, build friendships, and start to engage in lessons like phonics, maths, and creative play. Transitions like this can be challenging, but the children are adapting well and showing great resilience. I'm genuinely excited to see how they continue to grow, learn, and flourish over the year. In sha Allah, it's going to be a wonderful journey for all of us!

This week in **Year 1**, we have been working on recalling the alphabet, with a particular focus on identifying the position of each letter. At first, the children found it easy to say which letters were 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in order. But when asked about random letters further down the line, it proved to be more tricky. We were lucky to have some sunshine this week, so we took our learning outside. Working in partners, the children wrote out the whole alphabet in the playground.





This week in **Year 2** Computing, we explored the different parts of a computer and compared computers and laptops, discussing their similarities and differences. The children then used Sketchpad to design and create their own laptops, making sure to include all the essential parts of a laptop in their drawings.

This week in **Year 3**, we have been exploring the fascinating world of skeletons! The children have been busy learning about the human skeleton, including naming and identifying key bones such as the skull, spine, ribs, and femur. They've enjoyed discovering how our skeleton helps us move, protects our organs, and gives our bodies shape. It's been a fun and engaging week full of curiosity and great questions!





This half term, **Year 4** have begun reading *The Great Kapok Tree*. This week, the children familiarised themselves with the story before stepping into the shoes of its characters. Through role play, they brought the rainforest to life, using persuasive voices, expression, and body language to convince the woodcutter to change his mind. It was wonderful to see their creativity and confidence shine!

This week in Art **Year 5** have been looking at the work of Wasilly Kadinsky. The children have been inspired by his work of Abstract Art and have been looking at his various paintings. They have tried to recreate their own pictures of Abstract Art using pencils and ruler.





This week **Year 6**, put on their scientific hats and went exploring. After learning about living and non-living things and the characteristics considered when determining if something is a living organism, we went out to find examples of each. We had to carefully consider the items we found before determining if they were classified as 'living' or 'non-living'. Allhamdulliah we are surrounded by so many forms of life, carefully created by Allah وَسُبُحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى .

Islamic Studies

This week, in Islamic studies lessons, our students have been learning about the Six Articles of Faith in Islam. Through stories, discussions, and activities, they deepened their understanding of belief in Allah, the Angels, the Holy Books, the Prophets, the Day of Judgment, and divine decree. The children showed thoughtful reflection and curiosity, making strong connections between their learning and the values we uphold every day.





Furthermore, our students have been practicing the beautiful manners (Adaab) that Islam encourages in daily life. Together, we explored how showing respect to teachers and classmates, listening carefully, and speaking kindly create a positive learning environment. The children enjoyed role-playing different situations and reflecting on how good manners help everyone feel valued and respected.
