What have we been doing this week?

This week in **Reception**, the children went on their exciting trip to the Look Out Centre in Bracknell, buzzing with energy and curiosity. They walked through the interactive science exhibits, they pressed buttons, pulled levers, and experimented with lots of activities that were based around science. Outside, the children explored the climbing frame and the forest area, spotting tall trees to colourful birds.



This week, **Year 1** enjoyed an exciting school trip to the Natural History Museum in London. The children had a wonderful time exploring the fascinating artefacts, sculptures and displays throughout the galleries. One of our favourite areas was the animal section, where we learned all about different animal groups and observed a wide variety of creatures up close. A highlight of the trip was seeing the enormous blue whale!



This week in **Year 2**, we visited the Natural History Museum, where the children had the opportunity to explore a wide range of fascinating exhibits. They especially enjoyed discovering different types of animals, including mammals, fish and birds, which links directly to their Science learning about animal groups and their features. The children also looked at volcanoes and earthquakes, which helped them build on their understanding of natural phenomena.





This week in science **Year 3**, have been exploring nutrition and healthy eating. The children have learned all about carbohydrates, proteins, fats, and other essential nutrients and their roles in keeping our bodies healthy. To put their learning into practice, they designed their very own balanced packed lunches, thinking carefully about which foods provide the best fuel for growing bodies

Our **Year 4** pupils enjoyed a fantastic visit to Kew Gardens this week! They explored real-life habitats and took part in an exciting Rainforest Workshop, building on their Science learning and their persuasive writing in English about protecting rainforests. A memorable and inspiring day for all!



In **Year 5**, during our science lesson, the children investigated the relative sizes of the planets. We learned about the heliocentric model, and the children used a range of differently sized objects to represent each planet and match them to their correct names.

This week **Year 6** visited the RAF Museum in London to further their understanding of World War Two. The children participated in two workshops, exploring the contributions of different people, as well as a workshop which let them re-live and explore the impact of the Blitz and being inside an air raid shelter. It was amazing to see the range of aircraft used during the war and how they have changed since!



Islamic Studies

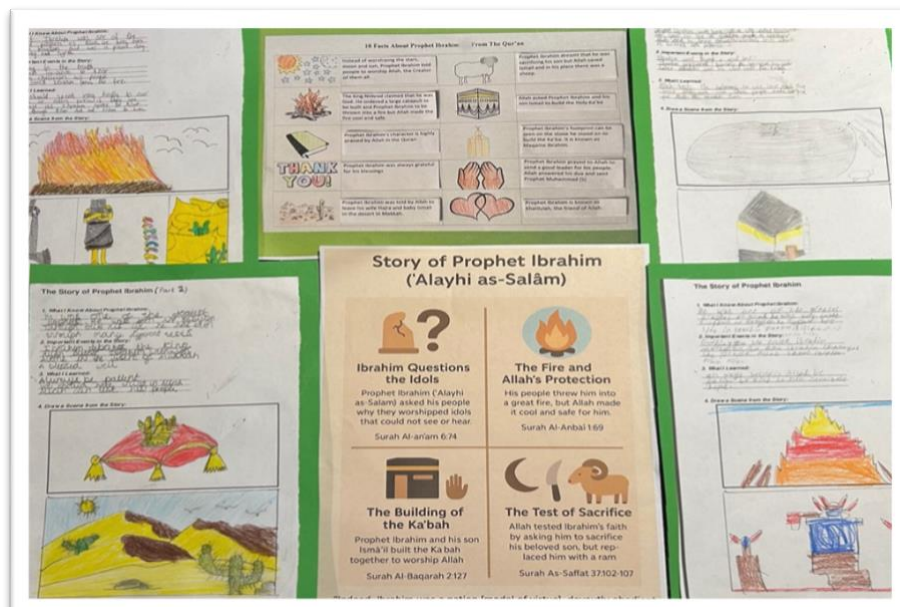
This week in Islamic studies lessons, the children deepened their understanding of the remarkable journeys of Prophet's Nuh, Hud, Ayyub and Ibrahim(peace be upon them). They explored how each Prophet was chosen by Allah سبحانه و تعالی to guide their people during times of moral decline and hardship.



Moreover, the children revisited how Prophet Nuh called his people to the worship of one God for centuries, while Prophet Hud courageously warned the powerful Ad tribe against arrogance and injustice.

Furthermore, they reflected on Prophet Ayyub's extraordinary patience through severe trials and Prophet Ibrahim's steadfast faith, from challenging idol worship to building the Ka'bah as a symbol of pure monotheism.

Through these stories, students recognised the significant contributions each prophet made in strengthening the message of tawḥīd and moral uprightness. They learned how resilience, trust in Allah سبحانه و تعالی, and unwavering dedication were central to every prophet's mission, even when challenges seemed overwhelming. Furthermore, the students reinforced their knowledge through engaging discussions, by creating thoughtful posters and storytelling.
