What have we been doing this week?



This week in **Reception**, the children started the planet activity by exploring the topic together and sharing their ideas. Each child was given a paper plate to create their own planet. Using paint and glitter, they designed their planets with different colours, patterns, and features, letting their imaginations guide them. Some planets had rings and others had stars. The children enjoyed explaining their creations to each other and were proud to show off their work.

This week, **Year 1** went on an 'object and material hunt' around the school, exploring everyday items and discussing what they're made from. The children discovered objects made from materials like plastic, metal, wood and fabric. We even found items made from more than one material, such as scissors (plastic handles and metal blades). It was a great opportunity for them to think about materials and how different objects are constructed.



This week in **Year 2**, we have been learning about what is needed to make a fire engine. The children explored different materials they could use to design and build their own fire engine, such as card and paper. They also investigated how axles and wheels work, and how these can be used to create a moving model.


This week in **Year 3**, the children have begun their new unit on multiplication and are learning all about arrays. They've been exploring how arrays help us visualise multiplication facts, organise equal groups, and build a strong foundation for times tables. It's been an exciting start, with lots of hands-on activities and great mathematical thinking!





In **Year 4**, the children investigated melting ice. Working in groups, they used beakers, thermometers and stopwatches to measure how long it took ice to melt in different conditions. Each group had 2 beakers, 1 with hot water and 1 with cold water and they observed which one melted the quickest. Before starting, the children discussed the variables they needed to keep the same to ensure a fair test and identified the one variable they would change. They worked carefully, recorded their results, and enjoyed carrying out the experiment.


This week in **Year 5**, as part of the Art lessons the children have been looking at how to make a Kalimba, an African instrument. We looked at various pictures and children drew their designs. This week children started painting paper bowls ready to make their kalimbas next week.



This week **Year 6** got technical with electricity. We learnt about different components used to make a series circuit, looking carefully at how to make it a complete and incomplete circuit. We also begun investigating the effect of more or less components within a circuit and the impact of increased voltage. We are looking forward to more investigations soon!


Islamic Studies




