

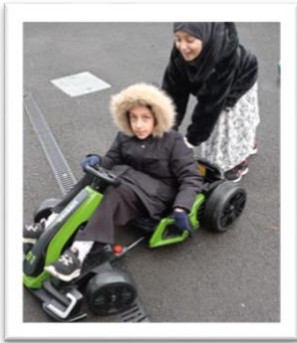

What have we been doing this week?

This week, **Reception** have continued their exciting exploration of planets, building on the work they started earlier in the term. The children continued decorating their planets that they had painted previously. They carefully stuck on sequences, sprinkled glitter, and used a range of materials to bring their planets to life.

This week in Geography, **Year 1** went on a walk around our local area of Chalvey. We walked around and spotted many familiar places: a church, two hotels, shops, a school, houses, a petrol station and car washes, bus stops and we also saw zebra crossings. Through this walk, the children learned more about their local area and community. By seeing familiar landmarks they developed a better understanding of how their neighbourhood is organised and what places are around them.



This week in **Year 2**, we have been learning about materials and exploring whether they are natural or human-made. We also looked closely at the properties of different materials, such as whether they are hard, soft, bendy or waterproof. The children enjoyed investigating everyday objects around the classroom and identifying which materials they were made from.

This week, the children in **Year 3** created bar graphs using the data they collected last week in Geography. After surveying adults in the local area about how they travel to work, the class used their findings to produce clear and accurate graphs that showed the different modes of transport. They worked brilliantly throughout the project and enjoyed seeing their research come to life.



In Science this week, **Year 4** explored the water cycle in a hands-on investigation. Each pupil designed their own mini water cycle using a ziplock bag. They carefully labelled the different stages: evaporation, condensation and precipitation, before adding water and taping the bags to our classroom windows. Over the next few days, the children will be able to observe how the sun helps water to evaporate, how droplets form, and how the cycle continues. Children also made the link to Islam where evaporation and condensation can be described as one of Allahs' signs that benefit creation. "And we send down from the sky pure water."



In Science, **Year 5** were studying about Planet Earth. We discussed how long it takes the Earth to go around the Sun. The children learnt about day and night. As part of the lesson children worked in pairs to observe how night and day occur around the world. We used a globe and torches to see when it is day and identify which countries have night.



This week in **Year 6**, we were exploring the concept of 'rationing' and how this was implemented and used during World War Two. We found that due to the shortage of supplies, people had limited resources; including food. We wrote a newspaper article about the reasons for rationing, how this impacted the civilians and helped people come together in order to make the most of things!

Islamic Studies

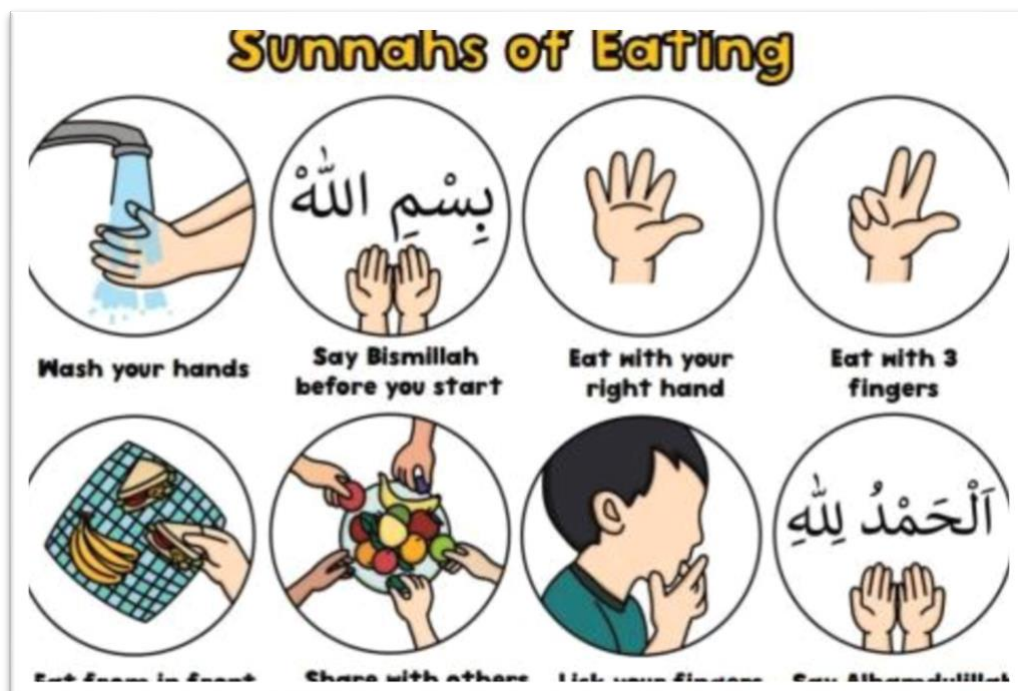


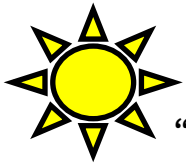
This week, in Islamic studies lessons, our children explored the inspiring stories of another two great Prophets, Prophet Isa عليه السلام and Prophet Yunus عليه السلام. We learned about Prophet Yunus's challenge of calling his people to Allah سبحانه و تعالى and how they rejected his message. His story reminded students of the power of sincere Dua, patience and always turning back to Allah سبحانه و تعالى.

Furthermore, through thoughtful discussions, the children also explored the spiritual journey of Prophet Isa عليه السلام, the miracles he was given and the challenges he faced when his people doubted his message. The children reflected on how trust in Allah تعالى سبحانه, humility and compassion shine through his life and teachings.

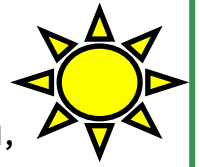
