This week, the children have been learning about the story "The Tiger Who Came to Tea." The children had a wonderful time exploring and learning all about tigers, including their habitat and what they like to eat. We discovered that tigers' favourite foods include meat, which the children found very interesting!



We enjoyed taking part in lots of creative activities. The children made tiger masks using a variety of paints and resources, exploring different textures and colours. They also created tiger playdough, mixing the colours of a tiger and using it to design their own tiger faces.



We also went on a tiger trail, where the children decorated the trail using cotton wool painting and enjoyed finger painting, helping to develop their fine motor skills and creativity.

In phonics, the children have been recapping all previously learned sounds and have started blending three-letter words, showing great progress and confidence.

In maths, we have been recapping numbers 1–10, practising counting and number recognition through fun and engaging activities.



It has been so lovely to see the children so engaged and curious this week. They have been using fantastic language, working together, and showing a real love for stories and imagination. We are very proud of how confident they are becoming in their learning!



Arabic & Islamic Studies

Alhamdulillah, this week in Arabic Studies the children were excited to learn the letter (س)! Through fun games and interactive activities, they explored the new vocabulary word (س) and practiced recognising its sound and shape. To strengthen their fine motor skills, the children enjoyed forming the letter using **sensory writing activities**, making learning both hands-on and memorable.

In **Islamic Studies**, the children learned about the special event of **Al-Isra wal-Mi'raj (The Night Journey)**. They explored **Masjid Al-Aqsa** by recognising its shape and learning about its importance in Islam. The children also enjoyed singing the “**Ramadan**” **nasheed**, which helped build excitement as we prepare for the blessed month ahead. In addition, they were introduced to a beautiful dua:
