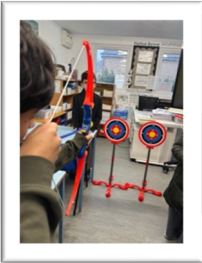


**السلام عليكم ورحمة الله وبركاته**

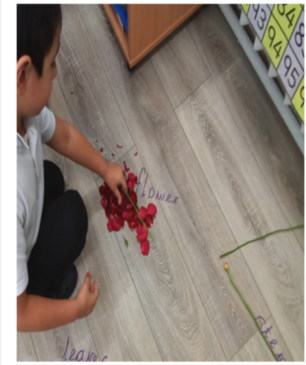


# What have we been doing this week?

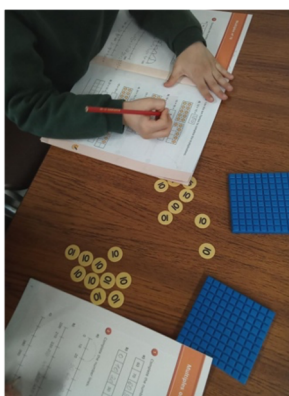
The **Reception** children have been exploring the story, *The Tiger Who Came to Tea*. They made their own sandwiches using a variety of spreads such as jam, cheese, and tuna. The children also engaged in role play, acting out the characters from the story and retelling events through imaginative play.



This week in **Year 1** we have been learning all about plants. We began our lesson by naming the different parts of a plant. The children then had the opportunity to look more closely at a rose, carefully separating it to see which parts they could find. They discovered that we couldn't see the roots, because roots grow underground and are usually removed from flowers we buy. After this, the children planted seeds in plant pots and we will be observing how the plant grows throughout the term.

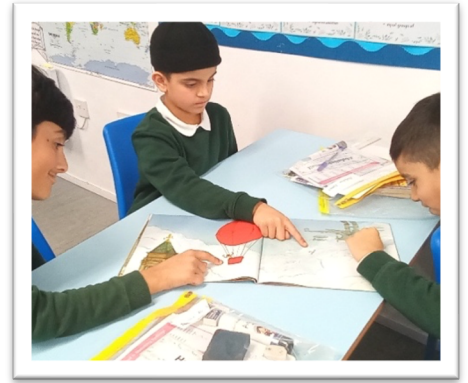


This week in **Year 2**, the children started a new science topic on plants. They explored different types of plants, including herbs, fruits, and vegetables, and investigated the school environment to identify the plants around them. The children learned about the different parts of a plant.



This week, the **Year 3** children have been learning about multiplication. They have been practising finding calculated answers using different strategies and exploring how multiplication works. They have also been focusing on the 10 times table, building confidence and fluency through regular practice.

This week in English, **Year 4** started their new book *Journey*. As it is a wordless book, the children carefully explored the pictures and used them to create and tell their own stories. They really enjoyed putting words to the illustrations and sharing their ideas with their peers about what they think is happening in the story. Over the coming weeks, the children will continue developing this story and exploring the different features and details shown through the pictures.



In Science, **Year 5** we have been learning about global warming. We discussed climate change and how we can reduce our carbon footprint. Children worked in groups to sort out statement to show whether they increase global warming or reduce global warming.

This week, **Year 6** got started with their maths unit- Measurement- with a hands-on outdoor activity. We went into our local area and used a ruler to measure different objects. After recording the measurements we converted them between cm and mm. We are looking forward to more conversions involving mass and capacity!





# Islamic Studies

This week, our students explored the beautiful Islamic teachings of cleanliness (Tahārah) and its importance in our daily lives. We introduced the well-known Hadith reminding us that “Cleanliness is half of faith,” helping children understand how Islam encourages both physical and spiritual purity.

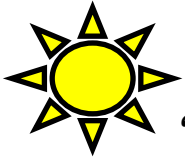


Moreover, Students also learned about Najasah (impurities), including its different types, with simple examples to help them recognize and avoid them in everyday situations. We also covered the basics of Wudu' and Ghusl, discussing when each is required and why they are essential acts of worship that prepare us for Salah and other acts of ibādah.

Furthermore, through discussions, visuals, and activities, children gained practical knowledge while strengthening their understanding of Islamic values.

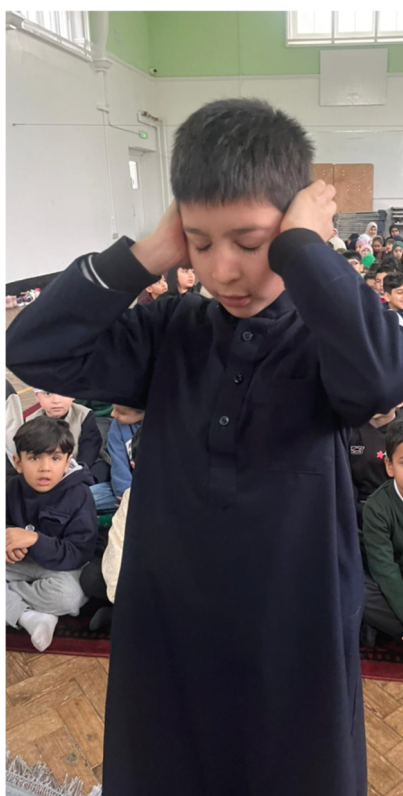
