





What have we been doing this week?

This week, **Reception** have been looking at patterns in Maths. They have enjoyed using a variety of different resources from the construction area to create and explore their own patterns. Through activities, the children were able to recognise, continue, and make repeating patterns while developing their problem-solving skills.



This week in **Year 1**, we have been learning all about adjectives and nouns and being able to write a noun phrase. The children have been learning how to use adjectives to make their sentences more detailed. We have been looking at dinosaurs and different animals to write our noun phrases. Have a look at their amazing sentences!

In **Year 2**, the children have been learning about plants in science. This week, they began an investigation to answer the question: Do plants grow healthier in the light or in the dark? The children started by sharing their predictions. As a class, we then planted two plants, placing one in the light and one in the dark. We will observe and record their growth over the next six weeks.





This week in Science, **Year 3** have been learning about different types of soil. The children explored a range of soils by feeling them and discussing their textures, and they learned what soil is made up of. They asked thoughtful questions and enjoyed investigating the differences between each sample through the hands-on activity.

This week in Science, **Year 4** investigated volume as part of our topic on sound. The children carried out an exciting experiment to explore which material is the best sound insulator. They made predictions before testing an alarm clock wrapped in three different materials: aluminium foil, cotton wool and bubble wrap. Using a decibel meter, the children carefully measured the volume of the alarm clock each time. After comparing their results, they concluded that cotton wool was the most effective insulator, as it produced the quietest sound. The children showed great teamwork and thoroughly enjoyed taking part in this investigation!



This week in **Year 5**, the children learned about the Mars Rover and how data is collected from Mars. They explored how rovers are programmed to follow precise instructions and investigated the role of RAM, discovering how the amount of memory in a device affects what it can do. During the lesson, the children carefully followed and tested instructions to successfully guide the Rover to collect data, demonstrating excellent teamwork, problem-solving and computing skills.



This week **Year 6** explored the different categories of objects and materials in relation to light. We understood how some objects and material can be classified as opaque, transparent and translucent. We then explored what happens when an opaque object blocks the light rays travelling from the source of light and understood how this formed a shadow. We used torches to explore shadow formation further and are looking forward to conducting our experiment soon!

Islamic Studies



This week in Islamic Studies lessons, students learned about Wudu (ablution) and its significance in Islam. They discussed how Wudu is an essential preparation for Salah, emphasizing the hadith of the Prophet Muhammad ﷺ:

"The key to Salah is purification, and the key to Paradise is Salah." Through this, the children understood the importance of cleanliness and spiritual readiness before prayer.

Moreover, they also learned the Fard (obligatory) and Sunnah acts of Wudu, gaining clarity on which steps are essential for its validity and which actions increase reward. Additionally, they explored different real-life scenarios to determine when Wudu remains valid or must be renewed.

Additionally, the students used bandages and plasters to explore and understand the Islamic rulings related to performing Wudu in cases of wounds or injuries. These discussions helped strengthen their understanding and encouraged practical application of their learning.



