Friday 10th April 2026

This week, our nursery children have been learning about *People Who Help Us*, with a special focus on the dentist. The children explored the important role dentists play in keeping our teeth clean and healthy. Through discussions and activities, they developed an understanding of why we must take care of our teeth and how dentists help us do this.



The children thoroughly enjoyed engaging in dentist role play, where they took turns being the dentist and the patient. This activity supported their communication and social skills, while helping them become more familiar and comfortable with visiting the dentist in real life.



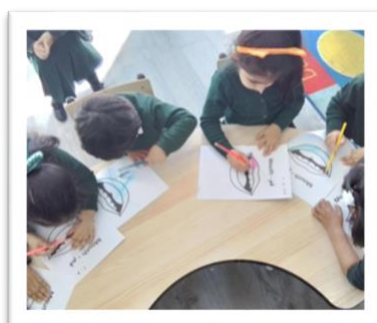
Using playdough, the children created their own models of teeth. This hands-on activity helped develop their fine motor skills while also reinforcing their understanding of the shape and structure of teeth in a fun and creative way.

We had group discussions about the importance of brushing our teeth properly. The children learned when and how to brush their teeth, and why it is important to keep them clean to prevent cavities and maintain good oral hygiene.



The children enjoyed decorating their own tooth templates using a variety of craft materials. This activity encouraged creativity and allowed them to express their understanding of healthy teeth in a colourful and engaging way.

To end the week, the children designed and created their own "tooth crowns". This fun activity helped consolidate their learning while also giving them a sense of pride in looking after their teeth.



Arabic & Islamic Studies

This week in Islamic Studies, the nursery children practiced the nasheed “Ya Nabi Salam Alayka.” They also learned about the Sunnahs of visiting a sick person and had the opportunity to apply these through engaging activities and role play. Additionally, they practiced the correct dua and its pronunciation when visiting someone who is ill:

“لا بأس طهور إن شاء الله”.

In Arabic, the children continued learning the names of body parts through fun activities including colouring, drawing, and pasting the parts in the correct place, while repeating the vocabulary to support correct pronunciation and recognition.
