



This week, our theme was *“People Who Help Us – The Vet.”* The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about how vets care for animals and why their role is so important. Through discussions and activities, they developed a better understanding of kindness and responsibility towards animals, reflecting on the beauty of Allah’s creation.

The children had great fun using play dough to mould different animals. This activity supported their fine motor skills while encouraging imagination and creativity.



Our vet role play area was a big success, with children taking on the roles of vets and pet owners. They used their communication skills to care for animals, showing empathy and developing their understanding of real-life experiences. The children also enjoyed making their own vet badges, which they proudly wore during their role play.

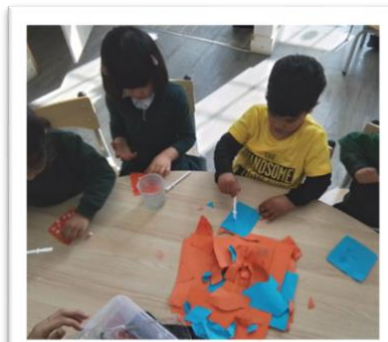
We completed a range of vet-themed worksheets, supporting early writing, matching, and understanding. The children worked hard and showed great focus during these tasks.



In our art activities, the children created animal collages using a variety of materials. This allowed them to explore textures and express their creativity while linking to our weekly theme.

In Maths, we focused on numbers and shapes. The children practised counting, recognising numbers, and identifying different shapes through fun and interactive activities.

During Phonics, we introduced the letters Z and X. The children explored the sounds these letters make and practised recognising them through songs, repetition, and engaging activities.



Arabic & Islamic Studies

This week in Islamic Studies, the children learned about the story of Aisha bint Abi Bakr (رضي الله عنها), practiced the nasheed "Ya Nabi Salam Alaika" and learned the Sunnah and manners of adorning themselves, along with the dua to be read when looking in the mirror.

In Arabic, they learned the letter ت, including its name, pronunciation, and writing, along with the new vocabulary word "تمر".
