



This week, the children enjoyed lots of exciting water play activities in the garden due to the hot weather. They had great fun splashing, pouring, and exploring water using different containers and toys. The children also learned about staying cool, sharing with their friends, and keeping safe in the sun while developing their sensory and social skills.

In Maths, the children used small blocks to practise counting. They carefully counted the blocks as they built different towers and compared which towers were taller or shorter. This activity helped to develop their number recognition, counting skills, and hand-eye coordination.



Our focus area this week was “Vets.” The children took part in a variety of activities linked to caring for animals. The children enjoyed pretending to be vets in our role play area. They looked after toy animals, checked them for injuries, and helped make them feel better. The children used their imagination and developed communication and social skills while learning about caring for animals.

The children also took part in activities about cleaning and caring for animals. We discussed the importance of cleanliness, being gentle with pets, and making sure animals are looked after properly. The children enjoyed washing and grooming the toy animals while learning about responsibility and kindness.



The children designed and created their own doctor bags for their vet role play. They decorated their bags and talked about the different tools a vet might use to help animals. This activity encouraged creativity, imagination, and speaking and listening skills.



Arabic & Islamic Studies

In Arabic Studies, the children learnt the Arabic letter Laam (ل). They practised recognising the letter, saying its sound, and tracing and writing it through different fun activities. The children also explored words beginning with the letter Laam to help develop their early Arabic language skills.



In Islamic Studies, the children listened to the story of Nafisah. We discussed the important lessons from her story, including kindness, good manners, and helping others. The children enjoyed talking about how they can show kindness and respect to their friends, family, and teachers in their everyday lives.
