Our focus area this week was Doctors, and the children thoroughly enjoyed exploring the important role doctors and nurses play in helping people. Throughout the week, the children took part in a variety of exciting hands-on activities linked to our theme. They carefully designed and made their own doctor bags using different materials and enjoyed discussing what doctors might keep inside them to help patients.



The children also engaged in imaginative role where they took turns pretending to be doctors, nurses, and patients. They explored tools such as stethoscopes, bandages, thermometers, and syringes whilst learning how doctors care for people when they are unwell. The role play activities encouraged the children to communicate with one another, ask questions, take turns, and use their imagination creatively.



Through these experiences, the children developed their speaking and listening skills, confidence, social interaction, and understanding of the world around them. It was wonderful to see the children so engaged, caring, and enthusiastic throughout the activities.

In Phonics, the children completed learning the alphabet and spent time recapping all the letters learnt so far. Using flashcards, the children identified different sounds, and when the Usteadah called out a letter, the children coloured it on a large, shared paper. This helped reinforce letter recognition in a fun and interactive way.

This week in Maths, the children focused on writing numbers **1-9**. They practised number formation through a variety of activities to help develop their confidence and pencil control.



Arabic & Islamic Studies

This week in Arabic Studies, the children learnt about the Arabic letter **فا**. They practised recognising the letter, repeating its sound, and exploring words beginning with **فا** through engaging activities and discussions.

In Islamic Studies, the children learnt that Allah **سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى** is the Greatest. They had meaningful discussions about where everything around us comes from and reflected on Allah's creations. The children also practised making duas together and learnt the importance of remembering Allah **سُبْحَانَهُ وَتَعَالَى** in our daily lives.
