This week at Nursery, our children have been exploring the exciting world of doctors and healthcare professionals. Through a range of fun and engaging activities, the children have been learning about how doctors help people and the importance of caring for others.

The children enjoyed engaging in doctor role play throughout the week. They explored the role of doctors, nurses, and patients using a variety of medical resources and costumes. This activity encouraged communication, imagination, turn-taking, and social interaction whilst helping children develop confidence through pretend play.



As part of our creative activities this week, the children enjoyed decorating their own ambulances and making their own doctor's hats using a variety of materials and colours. They discussed the important role of doctors and ambulances in helping people during emergencies whilst expressing their creativity through cutting, sticking, and designing. These activities supported the development of fine motor skills, imagination, and understanding of the world.



This week, the children explored mark making in sand using their fingers and tools to create patterns, shapes, letters, and drawings. This sensory activity supported early writing development, hand-eye coordination, and fine motor control while allowing the children to express themselves creatively.

The children used play dough to mould and create different doctor tools such as stethoscopes, thermometers, and syringes. This hands-on activity strengthened finger muscles, encouraged imagination, and supported discussions around our doctor theme.

In Phonics, the children focused on the special friends "ng" and "nk." They practised recognising these sounds in words through fun activities. The children enjoyed listening carefully and identifying words containing these sounds to support their early reading and speaking skills.



In Maths, the children learnt about different shapes and were encouraged to recognise shapes around us in the environment through discussions and activities.
